Project Summary: The Modesto City-County Airport has begun a series of rehabilitation projects in order to meet Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) standards for airport maintenance and to keep the Airport in good repair.

Projects Include:

- Airway Obstruction Project**
DESCRIPTION: Tree trimming and removal per FAA requirements
STATUS: 90% complete
- Wildlife Hazard Assessment**
DESCRIPTION: Assess hazards associated with wildlife in navigable air space, runways and taxiways per FAA requirements
STATUS: Study began in January 2015 (12 month study)
- Rehab Runway 10L/28R**
DESCRIPTION: Per FAA requirements, complete construction to remediate runway surface and correct signage deficiencies
STATUS: Design complete / Construction Phase out to bid
- West Apron Rehabilitation**
DESCRIPTION: Per FAA requirements, complete construction to remediate west apron and correct drainage deficiencies
STATUS: Design complete / Construction Phase out to bid
- Security and Perimeter Fencing**
DESCRIPTION: Per FAA requirements, complete construction to remediate perimeter airport fence
STATUS: Design complete / Construction Phase out to bid
- Commemorative Air Force Hangar Rehabilitation**
DESCRIPTION: Roof repair and other exterior and interior work
STATUS: Currently out to bid

Funding:

- Two FAA grants totaling \$1,250,000
- Applied for third FAA grant for \$3,900,000
- Commemorative Air Force Hangar Rehabilitation is funded by Aircraft County Tax Fund, amount TBA
